Walkers get ready for **BeachWalk 2011** *Florence Habitat's twelfth annual fund raising event*

Teams are being formed and sponsors recruited for BeachWalk 2011, Florence Habitat's twelfth annual building fund drive. As in previous years walkers, some adorned in brightly colored Habitat t-shirts, will stream along Heceta Beach on Saturday morning, September 17th.

Walkers will start from the North Jetty parking lot and walk Heceta Beach to Driftwood Shores, a distance of about one mile. Walkers can register and start anytime from 9:00 AM to Noon. Four legged friends are welcome. Refreshments and entertainment will greet walkers at the grassy courtyard of Driftwood Shores. Later, participants can walk back to the North Jetty or take a Habitat shuttle return if needed.

Groups come from local churches and organizations. Some teams have only a few members, others have up to 35 walkers. Individual walkers and groups obtain pledges to support them as they walk the beach. It's healthy, it's fun, and it's for a good cause.

Florence Habitat builders have completed 19 homes and are currently building their 20th and 21st at Keener Place. BeachWalk 2011 donations will help raise these roofs.

How to find a Habitat BeachWalk Walker

Florence Habitat is nurtured and successful because of hundreds of volunteers and generous financial support from individuals and the corporate community. The annual Florence Habitat BeachWalk creates a major portion of building funds needed to perpetuate the local Habitat for Humanity building program.

We don't expect everyone that wishes to donate to Habitat's BeachWalk to actually walk the beach. If you are able to hit the sand and join in the fellowship, it's fun and great exercise. But if you are unable to participate on September 17th please place your donation with a Habitat Walker, or drop it in the mail (FHFH, P.O. Box 3302, Florence, OR 97439).

Can't find a Habitat walker? Most faith organizations have Habitat representatives and generally BeachWalk teams itching to outperform everybody. Maybe you can challenge a few coworkers or neighbors to form a walking team. If this doesn't work for you call the Habitat office at 541-902-9227.

Did you know that your gift to Habitat does much more than help families build long-term financial security? Habitat's affordable, no interest house payments free up money for food, childcare, medicine and other necessities. And research has shown that decent housing improves health, increases children's educational achievement and strengthens community ties. Thanks to your support Habitat is transforming the lives of more deserving Florence families.

Florence Habitat for Humanity BeachWalk goal for 2011 is to launch over 450 walkers on September 17. If each represented \$100 in pledges Habitat would be well on its way toward covering construction costs for two more houses.

Ponder this . . .

In the United States alone, 95 million people have housing problems. That's one third of the nation. These problems include payments too large a percentage of their income, overcrowding, poor quality shelter and homelessness. Throughout the world, people live in inadequate housing, and Habitat for Humanity is dedicated to providing decent, affordable homes for those in need.

MESSAGE FROM HABITAT'S EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Things are certainly hopping at Habitat as we roll into the Fall. It is hard to believe the days are already shorter.

Things have been so busy that "those lazy, hazy days of summer" were only a dream. We have made it through the annual audit and are approved as a "going concern."

Two new families have been selected for Houses 22 and 23. We welcome Andrew and Britny Dolahite and Brandon and Brittany Moore who will partner with us to design and build another side-by-side duplex at Keener Place. We are in the process of purchasing another building lot under the auspices of Habitat for Humanity Oregon's John Grey Land Opportunity program, a grant designed to facilitate the purchase of one lot by every Habitat affiliate in Oregon.



Also in the works, of course, are BEACHWALK AND THE BLOCK PARTY, which will fill the entire day of Saturday, September 17th and prove, we hope, to be the most successful fund raising campaign ever for Florence Habitat. To date, however, only one faithful volunteer has appeared to help get the BeachWalk event up and running and I am getting desperate. If you can run a copier, make telephone calls and help with T-shirt distribution, work with a committee etc. please call the office (541-902-9227) and sign up to volunteer. Time is short and there is a great deal to do.

This is the year we have lost many helping hands due to job demands, illness, moving away from Florence and, sadly, death. I know there are people in Florence who believe in the Habitat mission of eliminating any and all substandard housing and promoting community development and responsibility via homeownership because they are strong supporters of this affiliate.

It is time to spread the word and the work to more people and encourage them to become involved in this mission. Please, all of you, make a plan to speak to at least one friend or family member about Habitat for Humanity and what it does to build community in Florence. No other organization in Florence is helping low income families realize the dream and the stability and security of homeownership.

A few blocks west of Highway 101 on Fifteenth Street at Nopal Street in Florence, you'll find Keener Place — a growing Florence Habitat for Humanity subdivision. If you have been a donor or supporter of Habitat and have not had an opportunity to actually see where your money goes, you must see this place.

Keener Place began to materialize as a plan in the summer of 2006, when Florence Habitat was desperately seeking land to build on. This parcel of property was formed in part thanks to the kindness and generosity of Tom Cheronos and Joyce Keener, who were long supporters of Habitat. Joyce, who shared her life with Tom, died in March 2006. After several years of planning that included a land swap with the City of Florence, Keener Place became a reality and the site for ten new family homes.

Florence Habitat for Humanity has made significant progress since its charter as an affiliate of Habitat for Humanity International, having constructed 19 family homes since 2000. The power of the community is evident in these homes. Community donations and volunteers are so critical for the continued success of the Florence Habitat program. Habitat started construction on its 17th Florence family home, the first of ten to be built at Keener Place, in February 2010. This house was completed and dedicated six months later. Homes #18 & #19 were started in September of 2010 and completed and dedicated in May of 2011. Keener Place construction on homes #20 & #21 was started in early July 2011 and expected to be finished with house #20 before the end of the year.

In Keener Place, Florence Habitat continues its mission to build basic, decent housing in partnership with selected residents who are in need of assistance. Families have been selected for homes #22 & #23, up next in Keener Place.

Warren Kelly, Founder of FHFH Passes

Florence Habitat lost one of its founding members with the August 15 passing of Warren Kelly. As a long-time member of the Board of Directors and head of the Building Committee, Warren will be greatly missed by the organization and by his many Habitat and Florence friends.

A native of Michigan, Warren joined the marines and served in the South Pacific, being wounded in the battle of Tarawa. Settling into a quieter existence after the war with Ruth, his wife of 67 years, Warren became a wildlife biologist and an expert on bighorn sheep. In 1986, he was awarded the prestigious "Honor Plaque" by Arizona's Desert Bighorn Council for his meritorious 30 years of service. After retiring from the forest service, the Kelly's moved to Florence. Both were deeply committed to Florence Habitat. Warren was also an active member of St. Andrews Episcopal Church.

In remembering Warren, Habitat's first board President, George Myers had this to say: "When I think of Warren, what comes to mind is his friendliness, his positive attitude toward life, his generosity, and his continuous service to Habitat." The world is a better place for Warren Kelly having been here. That also applies to Florence Habitat.

She received approval from the Cyberknife Clinic in San Diego to undergo cyberknife radiation treatments. The cost of this procedure was denied by her medical insurance and the Woodbury's had exhausted their financial reserves. The community responded and Glenna has begun treatment. HOMEOWNER MAINTENANCE SCHEDULE

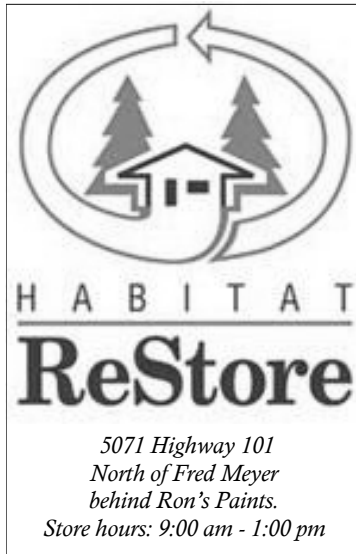
Below are listed activities that should be done annually, semi-annually, quarterly or in the spring/summer months:

INTERIOR

Check and clean kitchen stove & exhaust filters; clean refrigerator & coils. Clean disposal with ice cubes, cold running water & ½ cup of vinegar. Test and reset all GFI outlets. Check, test and clean smoke alarms. Check for leaks under dishwasher, refrigerator sinks and washing machines. Check overhead garage door and electric eye. Clean dryer vent and clean bath and laundry fans. Inspect plumbing shutoff valves, replace if necessary. Clean Heat Recovery Ventilator (HRV) filter. Have fireplace & chimneys cleaned & inspected by certified chimney sweep. Inspect & clean faucet aerators, shower heads, sink drains and overflows. Annual maintenance of heating system – refer to manufacturer's manual.

EXTERIOR

Check for tree limbs near or on roof. Check vents, louvers and chimneys for birds nests etc. Clear as necessary. Trim shrubbery away from building. Check flashing around skylights, chimneys and roof for debris buildup. Check exterior stained or painted surfaces – repaint if necessary. Clean gutters and downspouts, exterior site and yard drains. Check exterior cladding for splits, damage, rot, etc. Seal masonry chimney, patio mortar joints, exposed concrete. Check for cracks and voids in masonry and concrete – repair as necessary. Check exposed caulking and weather stripping – replace if necessary. Check septic tanks and pumps as necessary. Maintain grading sloped away from building at 1 inch per foot for six feet.
